



BURDEKIN RIVER BRIDGE- AUSTRALIA

The Burdekin Bridge (known as the Silver Link) spans the Burdekin River between the towns of Ayr and Home Hill, Queensland, Australia. Located on the Bruce Highway which is part of Highway 1, it is an important link in the national road network.

It is a road-rail bridge which provides high flood immunity link between north and south Queensland.

The Bridge was completed in 1957. Construction began 10 years earlier in 1947. 1103 meters in length, it is one of the longest multi-span bridges in Australia.



ZINGA has been used since 2005 for patch repair.

During 2010/2011 the under road areas of the 22 approach spans have been coated with ZINGA.
